





Sprinkling Rite (in place of the Penitential Act) (In the healing waters of baptism, we are freed from the powers of sin and death. May these waters draw us ever closer to Christ and his resurrection...)

Dear brothers and sisters,
let us humbly beseech the Lord our God
to bless this water he has created,
which will be sprinkled on us
as a memorial of our Baptism.
May he help us by his grace

to remain faithful to the Spirit we have received.

After a brief pause for silence, during Easter Time he continues with hands joined:

Lord our God, in your mercy be present to your people's prayers, and, for us who recall the wondrous work of our creation and the still greater work of our redemption, graciously + bless this water. For you created water to make the fields fruitful and to refresh and cleanse our bodies. You also made water the instrument of your mercy: for through water you freed your people from slavery and quenched their thirst in the desert; through water the Prophets proclaimed the new covenant you were to enter upon with the human race;

and last of all, through water, which Christ made holy in the Jordan, you have renewed our corrupted nature in the bath of regeneration.


Therefore, may this water be for us a memorial of the Baptism we have received, and grant that we may share in the gladness

of our brothers and sisters who at Easter have received their Baptism.



4. When he returns to his chair and the singing is over, the Priest stands facing the people and, with hands joined, says:


May almighty God cleanse us of our sins, and through the celebration of this Eucharist make us worthy to share at the table of his Kingdom.


May he, by whose redeeming work you have received the gift of everlasting freedom, make you heirs to an eternal inheritance. All: Amen.
